ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

To adopt the agenda as prepared for the Waste Management Committee meeting of Wednesday, August 17, 2016 as circulated.

DISCLOSURE OF PECUNIARY INTEREST: None declared.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Staff presented the draft Waste Management By-Law. Council to review and provide comments at the next waste management meeting on September 8, 2016.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Staff has positioned rocks by the gate at the Airy Landfill Site to prevent people from accessing the site during non-operational hours.
- On August 16th Dave Gatley, Works Superintendent joined in a teleconference with Kevin Mooder, Jp2g Consultant, Tammy Watson, Environmental Officer of the MOECC and Laurel Rudd, Surface Water Evaluator of the MOECC in regards to the Lyell Landfill Site expansion. During the teleconference they discussed the possible location of the proposed 40,000 cubic metre landfill expansion. Laurel Rudd discussed the findings of her Surface Water Review of February 17, 2016 and recommended to expand the site outside of the existing site footprint to the north. Kevin Mooder suggested an expansion in the same site footprint as described in the Jp2g letter of May 31, 2016. Laurel Rudd cited concern about possible existing leachate levels in Pete's Lake and would like two additional surface monitoring sites added along with sediment samples at four surface water monitoring sites. Kevin Mooder expressed concern about groundwater leachate behavior in a new location outside of the existing monitoring well network. The new surface water monitoring sites and sediment samples will be added to the monitoring

program to address concerns. Future discussions will include Shawn Kinny, Hydrogeologist of MOECC for groundwater assessment.

- Staff provided the committee with an update of the Household Hazardous Waste Day that was held on August 6th in Whitney. Approximately 95% of the waste was dropped off by 12:30 p.m. The committee approved the staff recommended time change to start at 9:00 a.m. and end at 1:00 p.m.
- Comment was made that Airy Landfill Site be organized in a way that the Landfill Site Attendant can have a clear view of all the drop off areas to help eliminate items from being disposed in the wrong drop off area. Site operations will be discussed with the attendant to develop greater efficiencies.
