Reduced cleaning time and equipment failures are expected as a result.

Facility:

- Current issues regarding mechanical heating systems have surfaced in various levels of urgency.
- A failure occurred in heating system at the Lester B. Smith building on February 4. During the investigation and repair further deficiencies with the pressure system were discovered.
- An ongoing deficiency in the “make up air” system at the Multi-Purpose building is being assessed for correction.

Health and Safety:

- All aspects of Occupational Health and Safety are being reviewed for compliance. Discussions within the roads department are underway with emphasis on the status of daily roles and responsibilities, training status and planning.

Waste:

- A garbage disposal bin at the Multi-Purpose building was burned last month. The physical asset liability for the loss of this bin is \$2,288.25. At present the replacement bin has been locked in an effort to prevent further incident. There haven't been any major problems brought forward with the locking of the bin at this time.

Works Superintendent, D. Gatley verbally reported:

- There is now a filling station for clear diesel at the Whitney Ambulance Bay.
- There was an issue with missing locks at the filling station in Madawaska. D. Gatley to get a quote on a gate.
- Investigating the possibility of getting bins for winter sand piles.

Administration Report

Clerk-Treasurer H. Luckasavitch provided a written report:

- Received confirmation today that the Minister of Municipal Affairs signed our Official Plan this morning. There is now a 20 day appeal period which ends on February 27th; if there aren't any appeals then the plan is in force. Was advised by Kevin Jarus that as of next week he will no longer be working for Municipal Affairs and that our new contact person once again is Edourd Landry.
- Met with Councillor Florent a couple of weeks ago at the Madawaska Multi-Purpose building regarding the installation of the pot sprayer and a new larger pot sink. H. Luckasavitch to obtain prices on good quality residential sprayers and a larger commercial sink; Councillor Florent to discuss with Madawaska Recreation Committee.
- Dishwasher at Madawaska Multi-Purpose building not cleaning dishes properly; water temperature is too low. Works Superintendent to investigate.
- Heater installed in the furnace room at the Madawaska Multi-Purpose building to avoid freezing of the water and furnace lines.
- Provided pictures of garbage bin that was destroyed by someone putting ashes into the bin. There was discussion on present use of garbage bins and ways to prevent misuse.
- Someone interested in purchasing the old garbage truck is scheduled to look at it tomorrow.

Clerk-Treasurer H. Luckasavitch verbally reported:

- Purchase of landfill site going ahead.
