5. PETITIONS, DELEGATIONS and/or PRESENTATIONS:

Delegation #1

- Mike Kalimin of Bongo Pix made delegation on behalf of a group of local artisans who request permission for the free use of the Centennial Park to host a Village Market on Sundays from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. between Victoria Day weekend until Thanksgiving weekend. This year the group would like to utilize a natural setting and hope to attract other local artisans. Centennial Park offers close proximity to Highway 60, view of Galeairy Lake and Madawaska River, and visitors would have the use of barbeques, picnic tables, outdoor privies, pavilion and the new proposed trail. Mr. Kalimin circulated photos of last year’s event and an email that was circulated to local businesses. To date, no negative feedback was received from local businesses. There were some concerns regarding litter being left behind from the market. Mr. Kalimin expressed that the group would ensure that all litter is picked up at the end of each market.

Delegation #2

- Mr. Pollak expressed that he and his wife were part of the Zoning-By-Law process from the beginning and have recently submitted a site plan application for their property along Hwy. 60. Mr. Pollak stated that he understands that most municipalities have planners on staff and realizes that the township can’t afford an in house planner and that planning fees are part of the process. However felt with his site plan application being the first in the Township of South Algonquin that Council consider a reimbursement for the township planner fees that are associated with his site plan application. Mr. Pollak also stated that he felt that rate payers will benefit from what is being proposed in his site plan application. Mr. Pollak also expressed that he felt that the proposed site plan agreement was a product from somewhere else and was very restrictive for this area. He offered to work with the township to produce an agreement that he felt would benefit both parties.
