Help for Low-Income Consumers (LEAP)

Financial Assistance

Low-income customers can get **up to \$500** in emergency assistance for your electricity bills (**\$600** if your home is heated electrically) and **\$500** for gas bills. The assistance is only available if you are behind on your bill – or in *arrears*. It is for emergency situations only and is not meant to provide you with ongoing help to pay your bills. You cannot receive more money than you owe on your bill.

VOTE BY MAIL ONLY

Ballots will be mailed the first week of October –please return your ballot as soon as possible to ensure it is received at the municipal office by October 27th, 2014. Please be aware it is a cost saving to the municipality if you drop off your ballot at the municipal office.

QUALIFICATION OF ELECTORS

A person is entitled to vote in a municipal election if he or she on voting day:

- Resides in the local municipality
- Is the owner or tenant of land in the municipality
- Is the spouse of such owner or tenant and;
- Is a Canadian citizen and
- Is at least 18 years old
- Is not prohibited from voting by law.

All electors should ensure that their names and relevant information are correct on the Voters' List. It is the responsibility of the elector to ensure the Clerk is aware of their proper mailing address and that they are listed on the Voters List.

Ballot Packages returned to the Township "undelivered" shall be marked invalid and stored in a separate, sealed ballot box, under the care of the Clerk. A new ballot shall be issued to the elector once a proper mailing address has been established.

Any person who receives a Ballot Package addressed to another person should contact the Township to receive further information and instruction as it is considered an offence under the Municipal Elections Act to exercise a vote other than your own vote.

NOTE: Qualified electors may vote **ONLY ONCE** in a local election within a given municipality. Electors who own or rent more than one property in the Township of South Algonquin may appear more than once in the Voters' List and may, therefore, receive more than one VOTE BY MAIL KIT. **The onus is on these electors to vote ONLY ONCE**. The ballot must be cast in the Ward within which the elector maintains his/her permanent residence.

Please be aware that if you are a tenant in the Township of South Algonquin it is your responsibility to notify the office of your mailing address because the mailing address we have on file unless we have been notified is for the owner of the property. This inquiry can be done by telephone, in person or by email.

A person may make an application to the Clerk requesting that they be added to or removed from the Voters' List or that information on the Voters' List relating to them be amended by completing and filing the prescribed form available at the municipal office located at 7 Third Avenue, Whitney, Ont. during regular office hours between September 2, 2014 to October 24, 2014 and to the close of voting on October 27, 2014. The application shall be in writing on the appropriate form (FormEL15) available at the municipal office and shall be filed in person, by the applicant or his/her agent or by mail, by the applicant. Proof of identity and residence as prescribed in O.Reg. 304/13 will be required.

Return of Completed Ballots

Electors may return their ballot to the Township of South Algonquin by pre-paid mail. The last day to mail your ballot in order to guarantee delivery is received is October 18, 2014. Electors may personally deliver their voting package, to the Municipal Office 7 Third Avenue Whitney, Ont. open between 8:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Monday to Friday until October 24th, 2014 and from 8:30 a.m.-8:00p.m. Monday October 27th, 2014(Voting Day) (drop box also available at this location between entrance doors). Ballots received will be hand-counted at the Municipal office at 8:00 p.m. on Voting Day. Unofficial results will be made available at the Township of South Algonquin and on the Township website. Ballots eligible for counting MUST be returned no later than 8:00 p.m. on Voting Day (October 27, 2014).
